INCLUSIVE PLAY

The playgrounds in this alternative are on flat terrain and utilize integrated ramps within the play structures to provide access to higher play elements and slides.









ENTRY PLAZAS AND GATEWAYS

Gateways are located at both entrances to the play areas. The Spanish revival style incorporates the park name in tiles under the arch. At the entry and throughout the park, large-scale images of historic photos show current residents Beaumont from the past.





PLAYGROUND

Elevated mound representing the mountain with climbing features to get up to high vantage points and look out over the landscape.













SPLASH PAD

Separated area representing a mountain grotto and the start of water flowing down into the valley. Children can follow the visual cues of water down to the dry creek area.



INCLUSIVE ELEMENTS

All play equipment includes accessible elements and site topography allows for accessible routes to the top of the slides. The playground will also include some features to enhance the experience for children of all abilities.









Texture changes in pathways enhances the a sensory experience.

GATEWAY

Entry to the play area continues the mountain reference by utilizing the City logo to create a steel, wood, and stone archway.



RESTROOM MURAL

The restroom is located between the splash pad and the playground, creating the opportunity to use one side for art or create a "selfie moment."



These integrated spaces prioritize use by older youth. It is located in close proximity to the community porch as a hangout space for older kids.



Existing Tree Canopy Cover





Existing + Proposed Tree Canopy Cover


