
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT UPDATE Ending October 2022

 - Many seniors have indicated that they no longer pass out candy and don't get to see their grandchildren dressed up during Halloween. This event benefitted both pre-school aged children, their families, and our seniors by bringing the two groups together; creating an agespecific event for youth while allowing our seniors to admire costumes and interact with the visitors. At the end of the treat trail, staff assisted with a small craft and the CRC playground was open.

- Senior Craft Corner Seniors interested in arts and crafts are encouraged to join us the first Tuesday of each month for a holiday/seasonal craft. Our first event in October featured painting ceramic pumpkins
