Key Dates for Legislation

- May 2nd: Last day for Policy Committees to hear and report fiscal bills
- May 9th: Last day for Policy Committees to hear and report non-fiscal bills.
- May 23rd: Last day for fiscal committees to hear and report to the floor bills introduced in their house. Last day for fiscal committees to meet before June 9

AB 400 (Pacheco)

Topic: Law Enforcement – Police Canines
Summary: Mandate a canine program
policy that aligns with POST by 2027.
Status: 04/09/2025 last hearing on the
item

Implication: Would require the City to update canine policy. Could increase costs to the City based on training and policy implementation.

AB 451 (Petrie-Norris)

Topic: Law Enforcement Policies on **Restraining Orders Summary:** Requires local law enforcement agencies to develop and implement policies with restraining orders that include firearm restrictions. **Status:** 4/9/2025 – Assembly Appropriations **Implication:** Would require the City to develop policies to comply by 2027. May require additional training for officers.

AB 247(Bryan)

Topic: Incarcerated Crew Members: Wages **Summary:** Mandates an hourly wage of \$19/hr. and credit reduction for incarcerated persons who were assigned to fire incidents. **Status:** Pending legislative review in the Assembly

Implication: Budget increases for the County, which could be passed on to contracted cities.

AB 306 (Shulz, Rivas)

Topic: Moratorium on code updates
Summary: It would establish a six-year moratorium on any city code updates.
Status: 4/23 Re-referred to committees on housing.

Implication: Would have an impact on the City as we are currently going through a zoning code update.

SB 415 (Reyes)

Topic: Planning & Logistics Bill **Summary:** Aims to enhance land use planning concerns for logistics (AB 98 clean-up bill) for clearer definitions for logistics.

Status: 4/25 Rereferred to committees for review

Implication: The city would need to update land use policies and transportation plans. (PLUS Policy).

AB 1060 (Avila Farias)

Summary: Requires invoices from city attorneys made available without redaction. Status: 3/10 Still within Assembly committees Implication: Could impact the privacy of legal matters before they are settled if details are provided in invoices.

AB 735 (Carillo)

Topic: Planning and Logistics Bill
Summary: Changes to logistics
development standards, air quality
monitoring, and truck routing plans.
Status: 4/30: Scheduled for hearing in
assembly
Implication: We may have to evaluate our
PLUS Policy if significant changes are made
with these bills.
