A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEAUMONT TO ADOPT A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/26 FUNDED BY SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City, will receive an estimated \$ 1,506,411 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2025-26 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the ninth year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities and the project list; and

WHEREAS, the City used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City streets and roads are in an "good" condition and this revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a "Excellent" condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets

infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the City Council of the City Beaumont, State of California, as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
2. The following list of newly proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with Fiscal Year 2025/26 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:
 - a. Annual Citywide Street Rehabilitation and Maintenance 25/26:
 1. Description: the project will consist of applying slurry seal treatment, and mill and overlay of existing streets within the City of Beaumont, consisting of local, collector, and secondary streets that are identified in the City's Pavement Management Report.
 2. Schedule: Construction is anticipated to begin in May of fiscal year 25/26 and completion is anticipated in August 2026.
 3. Useful Life: Slurry seal treatment is projected to increase the minimum useful life of streets by 5 years to a maximum useful life of 7 years. New asphalt surface is projected to increase the minimum useful life of streets by 15 years to a maximum useful life of 30 years.
 4. Location: The streets that are applicable to receive slurry seal are as follows:
 - i. A portion of the Fairway Canyon neighborhood, general boundaries are San Timoteo Canyon Rd., Stockton St., Cherry Valley Blvd. and the northern City boundary.
 - ii. A portion of the Tournament Hills community between Cherry Valley Blvd. and Desert Lawn Dr.
 - iii. A portion of Union St. and Hannon Rd. bounded by the northern City boundary.
 - iv. A portion of the Town Center neighborhood, general boundaries are Olive Ave., Sixth St., Vallecito Ave., and Twelfth St.

- v. A portion of the Sundance neighborhood, general boundaries are Cherry Ave., Eighth St., Xenia Ave., and Oak Valley Parkway.
- vi. A portion of Highland Springs Avenue between Eighth St. and the UPRR Right-of-Way.
