**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BEAUMONT
EXEMPTING GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES
FOR NON-PUBLIC SAFETY RELATED PERMIT FEES AND COSTS
FOR SPECIAL EVENTS**

WHEREAS, the City of Beaumont (“City”) would like to collaborate and cooperate with other governmental agencies to bring events and activities to the City; and

WHEREAS, Community events foster community engagement, promote public health, safety, and welfare by providing entertainment, economic development, and activities for the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the limited resources available to other governmental agencies to bring events and activities to their respective agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City would like to collaborate and cooperate with other governmental agencies in bringing quality events, programs, and activities to the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, in the spirit of collaboration and cooperation the City would like to exempt other governmental agencies from certain special event fees and costs; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that the fee exemption will provide financial assistance to other governmental agencies with the goal of increasing the number and quality of programs offered by other governmental agencies in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEAUMONT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City hereby exempts other governmental entities from the payment of special event fees and costs except for fees and costs for public safety services.

Section 2. Public safety services will include, but are not limited to, police protection services, fire inspection, monitoring, and/or protection services, and building safety review and inspection services.

Section 3. Public safety service costs will be determined by the City and an estimate for those services will be provided to the other government entity 30 days prior to the special event. The governmental entity will be billed for the actual cost of public safety services and will pay the City for said services within 30 days of receipt of the bill for the actual cost of the public safety services provided by the City.

Section 4. In the event public safety services are required including public safety services due to, but not limited to, anticipated traffic control and public safety risks associated with the event, governmental entities will be required to provide the City with a site plan and other

relevant information requested by the City in the form of a Special Event Permit Application in order for the City to determine the type and amount of public safety services required for the special event.

- a. The information required by this paragraph shall be submitted to the City at least 60 days prior to the special event.
- b. Failure to provide the information required by the City at least 60 days prior to the special event may result in one or more of the following:
 - i. City withholding its approval for a license required by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC); or
 - ii. City denying the requested public safety services for the event; or
 - iii. Imposition of a deposit for the special event and all future special events.

Section 5. This resolution will be effective on January 1, 2026, and remain in effect until such time the City Council acts to modify or repeal.
