CITY MANAGER'S WELCOME

I am happy to share the City Manager's monthly report, which highlights the City of Beaumont's major activities and achievements for January 2026. Our departments have remained committed to providing outstanding service to the community while advancing the City Council's strategic priorities.

Highlights from January include:

- Celebrating Awards and Grants: We have started the year with many celebrations, including Public Works' APWA Award for Second Street Extension Project and Wastewater's CWEA 3PS Grant for Public Education!
- "Beaumont on the Move" - Upcoming Community Workshop: As a long-term, community-driven effort to guide future transit improvements, Beaumont on the Move will be hosting workshops in February to seek more feedback.

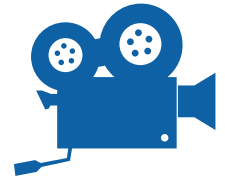

PREPARATION FOR 2026 DEPARTMENT FILMING

Staff has secured a contract to provide standardized video production across departments, including Police Department recruitment, quality-of-life features, and updates on City projects.

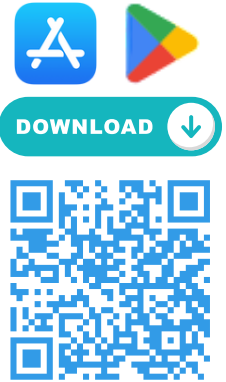

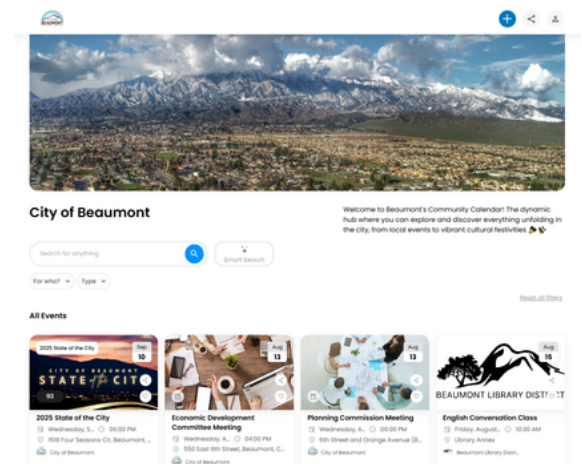

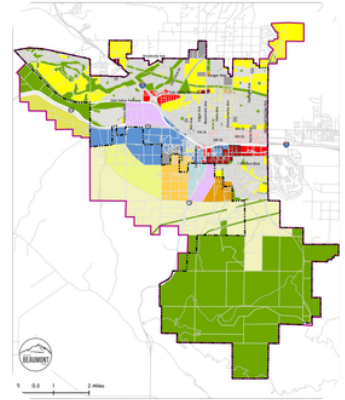

Key Updates

Elevate Beaumont 2040: The Planning Commission recommended, and the City approved, updates to the rules for subdivisions to better implement the Elevate Beaumont 2040 General Plan. This includes creating a clearer, easier-to-use process for managing growth. As part of this process, a plan was approved to divide about 15 acres in the Seneca Springs area into two parcels.

Other updates included expanding registration requirements for vacant or abandoned properties and updating the City's food truck regulations. These changes went into effect on January 16, 2026.



Upcoming Initiatives

Billboard Prohibitions Workshop: The City released a survey to gather community input on the look and placement of billboards and other signage. Feedback will help guide potential rules to allow limited, well-regulated signs that could generate revenue while maintaining consistent, modern designs. Once the survey results are in, a workshop will be held before the Planning Commission to review current rules and potential updates.

Golden Triangle Annexation: Staff explored potential grant opportunities to support emergency preparedness and disaster recovery for the Golden Triangle Annexation area. These grants could help the City improve emergency readiness, strengthen disaster response and resiliency, support managed growth, and promote economic development in more isolated areas.

One Network for Entitlements (ONE): ONE Beaumont is the City's new unified land use application, designed to make it easier for property owners, residents, and businesses to apply for planning approvals. Instead of submitting multiple separate applications, ONE Beaumont combines them into a single, coordinated process.

The goal is to make the City's development review process clearer, more predictable, and more user-friendly, while staying consistent with the Beaumont Municipal Code, the Elevate 2040 General Plan, and state laws.

BUILDING & SAFETY



Ziggi's Coffee: On January 26, the Certificate of Occupancy was issued for Ziggi's Coffee on 1st Street. The project highlighted opportunities to improve City processes, and staff are working to streamline and consolidate applicant and developer submissions to make permitting and licensing more efficient.



COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT

Removal of Signs in Public Areas: Staff identified that the City can remove and store, at the owner's expense, any signs in public areas that pose a hazard to pedestrians or vehicles. This includes advertisements, posters, or other signs attached to street infrastructure or utility poles. This effort supports the City's goal of keeping signage safe, orderly, and visually appropriate while respecting free speech.



In a recent effort lasting about 15 hours, staff removed over 200 signs, contacted the businesses or vendors, and destroyed unclaimed signs after 30 days in storage. One business came to pick up their signs during this period.

After previous enforcement challenges, the business is now in full compliance.

COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT (CONT.)

The City's website was updated to help residents and businesses understand how to address, appeal, or pay code violations.

On January 22, 2026, staff launched a proactive effort to ensure vendor compliance in the City, engaging with five vendors during the activity.



One permitted truck was operating in the wrong location and was asked to relocate. Staff also reminded the vendor of the City's rules for approved vending spots.



The second food truck was fully licensed and in an approved location, following all City rules.



Two local vendors received guidance on obtaining licenses and operating in approved areas and were asked to temporarily close and relocate.



The fifth vendor, a coffee cart without approval, received guidance on obtaining a permit and operating legally in Beaumont.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

FIRE PREVENTION

Target is moving forward with plans to submit a Fire Temporary Access Plan, allowing construction to begin soon.

Apartments on 8th Street are almost ready for final inspection and are finalizing their battery storage requirements.

Meritage has completed the secondary access requirements, allowing building permits to move forward for homes that don't require fuel modification inspections.

Upcoming Initiatives

Staff will participate in a mid-February training with Riverside County Fire to review potential fire code updates.

PLANNING

Beaumont Heights/Orbis

Staff continues weekly coordination on a proposed industrial and warehouse development totaling about 5.3 million square feet, along with the potential annexation of approximately 558 acres near SR-79 and Laird Road. Required studies, including entitlement and fiscal analyses, are underway and must be completed before annexation can move forward.

Title 16 - Subdivisions

Staff is moving forward with changes to speed up and streamline map approvals, helping the City manage growth and deliver infrastructure on time.

Applying for Prohousing Designation Program

Staff submitted the Prohousing Designation application with Council approval, enabling the City to access funding and further advance its ongoing affordable housing efforts.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Turf Aerator Equipment

The City has added a turf aerator to its maintenance equipment. Aeration is essential for healthy turf because it reduces soil compaction and breaks up thatch buildup.

By creating small holes and removing soil cores, aeration allows air, water, and nutrients to reach deeper into the roots. This encourages stronger root growth, improves drainage, and produces thicker, healthier, and more resilient turf.



Annual Mulch Program

The City's annual mulch program is currently underway and progressing as planned. Staff presented a report on the program's scope and objectives at the Parks & Recreation Committee meeting on January 26.



Disc Golf Improvements

Work on improving the disc golf course is ongoing. Staff presented a report on the project at the Parks & Recreation Committee meeting on January 26.

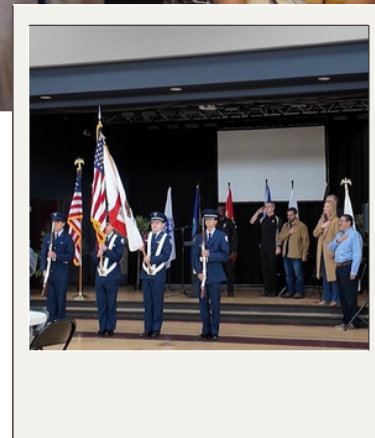
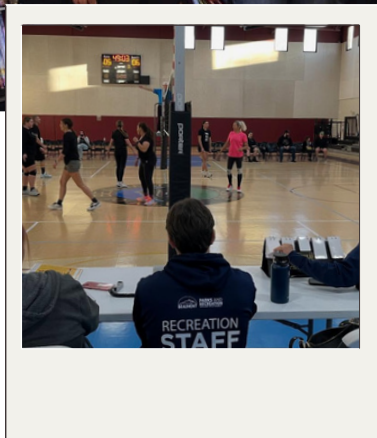

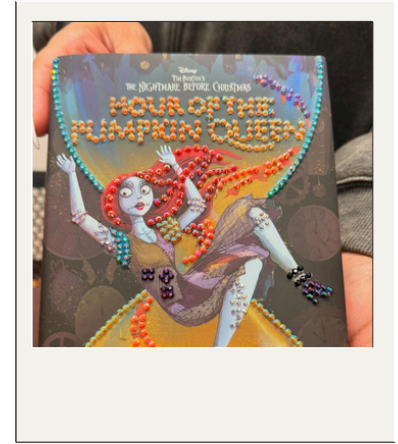

Key Updates & Milestones



The Economic Development Strategic Plan (EDSP) consultant team, TIP Strategies, held a series of individual stakeholder meetings in January.

Additionally, the EDSP Steering Committee met to review and provide feedback on a draft of the plan's baseline data analysis and interactive dashboard.

As part of the next steps for EDSP, three community visioning workshops are scheduled: February 5 & 6 (City Hall) and February 11 (Virtual).

The Pass Area Biz Hub – in partnership with the University of California, Riverside (UCR) and Pass EDA with event support from the Beaumont Chamber of Commerce – hosted its first public event on January 13.

Titled The Power of AI, the event featured UCR entrepreneur-in-residence Philip Topham, who provided a broad overview of how leaders can think practically about using artificial intelligence in both business and life.

Key Updates & Milestones (cont.)

Economic Development Director Kirk Pelsler and Economic Development Manager Laura James spoke at Urban Land Institute's (ULI) TRENDS event on January 20.

Approximately 80 people attended, including brokers, developers, government leaders, and others involved in the development pipeline.



With environmental reports complete for the vacant Cleaners building, the City will move forward with an RFP for design services in mid-February.



The Pass Area Veterans Expo and Job Fair was held on January 24. The event was well attended by the public and featured strong participation from employers and service organizations.



The first edition of Beaumont's quarterly Economic Development Newsletter was sent out on January 28. The newsletter will feature Biz Hub Partner Profiles, upcoming events, business-focused City news, and Business Spotlight features.

Key Updates & Milestones (cont.)

Planning has begun for ICSC Las Vegas 2026. Economic Development is collaborating with the Communications team and exploring whether external providers (e.g., lead generation, demographic data, etc.) are needed to provide additional support.



Riverside County's Economic Development Strategic Plan has been approved by the U.S. Economic Development Administration and now serves as the County's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).

Beaumont has five projects in the CEDS appendix: public safety complex, wastewater treatment microgrid initiative, wildfire mitigation, downtown revitalization, and the Pennsylvania Avenue Grade Separation.

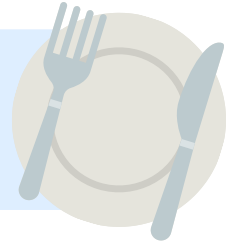

Beaumont's Second Street Extension Wins 2025 Award:

The Second Street Extension project was named the 2025 Transformative Corridor Connectivity Project of the Year by the American Public Works Association (APWA)'s IE Branch on January 22! This award celebrates the City's work to improve safety, connectivity, and accessibility for everyone in the community.



Sports Park Field Lighting and Field Expansion: Zeco, Inc. has successfully installed six Musco light poles on the south side of the Sports Park after the concrete foundations reached the required strength.

Planning is now underway for the installation of the remaining seven Musco lights on the north side, and the team is coordinating closely with Community Services staff to minimize impacts and keep work running smoothly. Sewer line work is progressing, and crews are completing the final stages of grading.

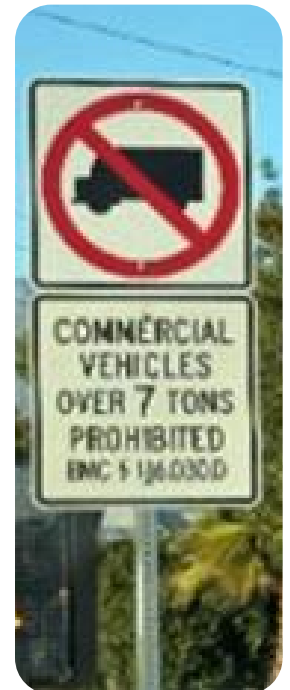


Milestones & Key Updates (cont.)

New Commercial Truck Route Signage Installed: The City's Commercial Truck Route Program guides where large trucks (over 7 tons) can safely travel within the City limits.

In January, new signage and pavement markings were installed to direct trucks to streets built for heavy traffic, while minimizing or restricting truck travel near residential areas, schools, downtown streets, and areas with high pedestrian and bicycle activity.

The program is based on the City's General Plan and supported by traffic studies to ensure safe and efficient travel throughout Beaumont.



New Traffic Signal Planned at Pennsylvania & Second Street: On January 20, 2026, the City Council awarded a task order PO to STC for the design of a new traffic signal at Pennsylvania Avenue and Second Street. City staff are scheduling a design kick-off meeting to begin the project.

Desert Lawn Slope Restoration Update: On January 20, 2026, the City Council awarded a contract to Cozad and Fox to prepare engineering designs for the repair of the storm drainpipe and to restore the slope integrity. A kick-off meeting with the consultant will be scheduled soon.

Brookside Street Improvements Update: On January 27, the City publicly advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for professional design services for the Brookside Avenue Street Improvements project. Proposal submissions are expected to be opened at the end of February.

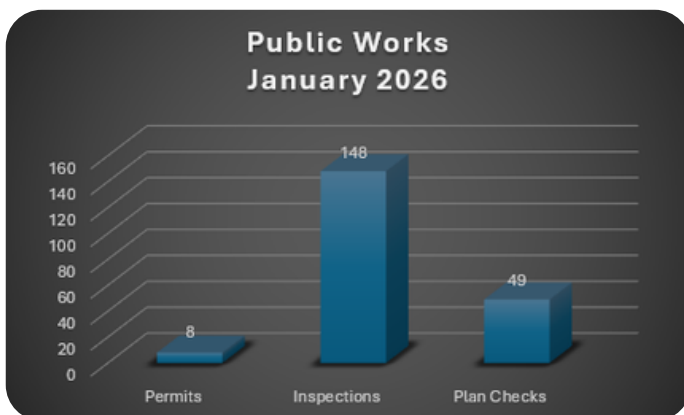

Beaumont on the Move @ Veterans Expo!

On January 24, staff attended the Pass Area Veterans Expo and Job Fair, engaging with community members and gathering input on Beaumont on the Move, the City's 10-year transit improvement plan, through interactive activities and giveaways.

Staff also highlighted Commuter Link 125, which provides weekday service to the Loma Linda Veterans Affairs Hospital. The route runs five days a week with four trips per day, all for just \$1 per ride.

RIDE FREE ON TRANSIT EQUITY DAY

Transit Equity Day is observed on Rosa Parks' birthday in honor of her role in the Civil Rights Movement and highlights the importance of equal access to public transportation. In her honor, all Beaumont Transit rides were free on February 4. All routes. All riders. All day.

Steven Mireles applied and received a California Water Environment Association P3S Grant. This grant was awarded for his Anti-Clog Environmental Education Project.

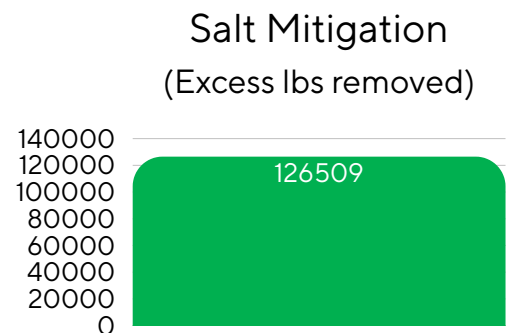
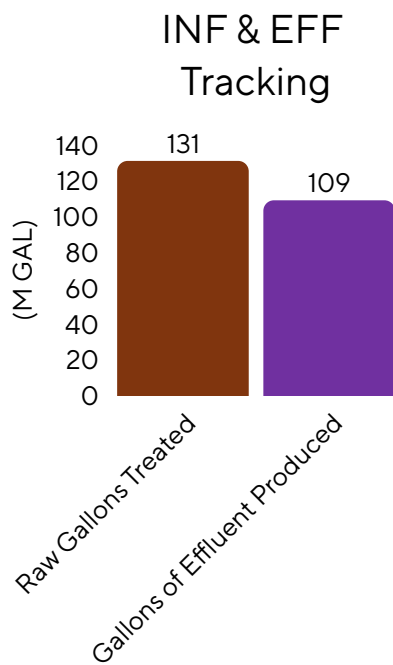
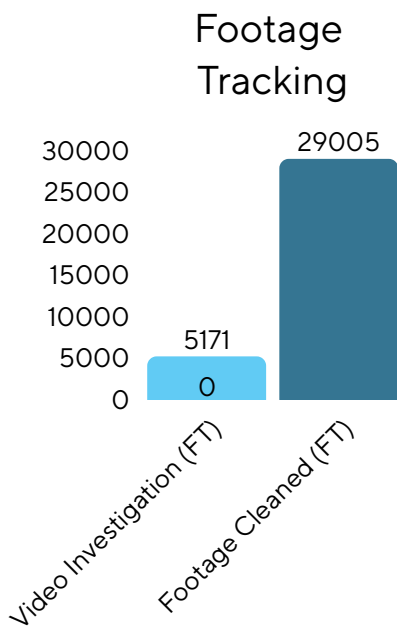
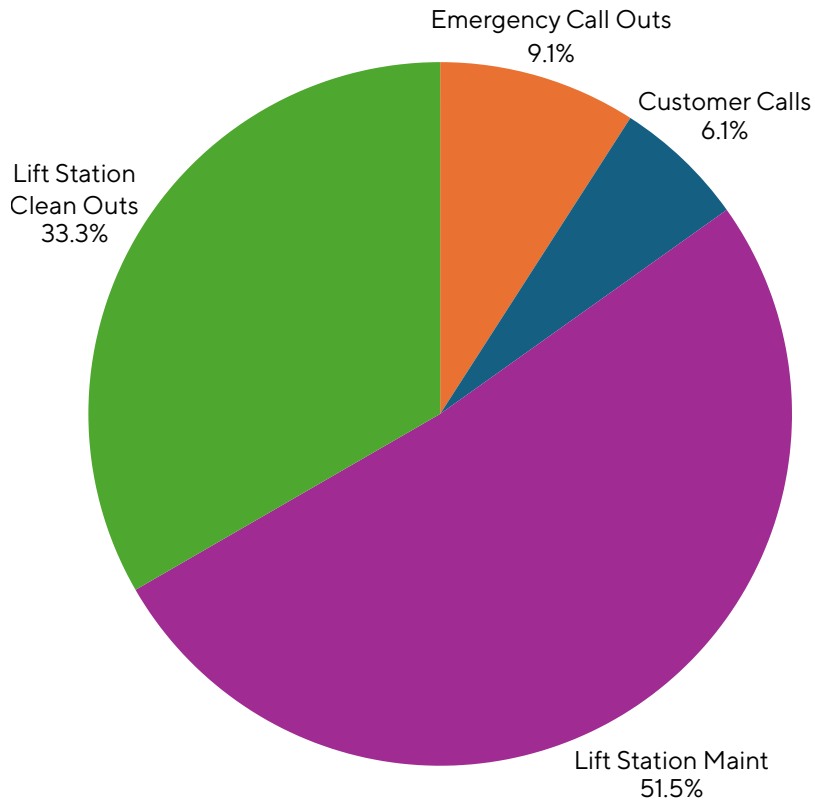
